TCU's fraternity and sorority community represents more than 48% percent of the undergraduate student population, over 4,700 students, throughout five diverse councils: the Interfraternity Council (IFC), the Independent Greek Council (IGC), the Multicultural Greek Council (MGC), the National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) and the Panhellenic Council. At TCU, the goal of membership is to complement the student's academic experience by providing personal and professional development. It is the university's hope that fraternities and sororities are building better men and women through the establishment of intergenerational relationships, the adoption of shared values, and the development of the skills needed to become leaders in a global community. It is also the hoped that fraternities and sororities provide a sense of community for members and enrich the overall campus culture.

In an effort to enhance goal attainment and ensure transparency and accountability, the Division of Student Affairs conducts a campuswide assessment of the impact of fraternities and sororities on the campus community every three years. The Office of Student Life Analytics conducted this year's study during 2022 spring semester. The assessment involves all undergraduate students, regardless of affiliation status.

The CampusLabs survey platform was used to distribute the survey, collect responses, and analyze results. The initial survey invitation was sent to 3,214 undergraduate students. Four reminder emails were sent every four days after the initial invitation. A total of 512 students responded to the survey for a 15.93% response rate. Of the 512 that responded, 400 completed the survey for a 78.13% completion rate. These results yield a 3.1% margin of error at the 95% confidence level.

The results presented on the following pages include an overall representation of the student responses regardless of affiliation status. Reports based on affiliation status are under separate cover.
